Non-partisan and not for profit, we can connect with stakeholders across the Midlands and hold the key debates and discussions to advance our region.

We host a range of in-person events, such as roundtables, hustings, lectures and evening receptions, and hold 'the policy event for the Midlands' annually through our Connections for Prosperity conference. All our events have the constant theme of bringing people together to explore ways in which we can do things even better as a region.

Alongside our events programme we produce research to inform and help shape public policy and provide thought leadership on some of the biggest challenges and opportunities facing society.

This document provides a range of opportunities that we are proud to be able to offer organisations to partner with us to help shape a 'better' region.

Since its launch in 2021, Reimagining the Region has become the premier regional network to connect business, policy makers, not for profits and academia together. The network has grown to 70+ member organisations who all want to see the region thrive.

Members pay an annual membership fee to join the network, which is based on the number of employees within their organisation, ranging from £450 for 1-10 employees to £1,700 for 51+ staff (plus VAT).

Members receive invitations to exclusive receptions in both Westminster and the West Midlands, and are also given the opportunity to participate on our panels, steering group discussions, as well as provide thought leadership for our primary areas of research interest.

A Milestone Year for the Centre for the New Midlands

2024 marked a pivotal year for the Centre for the New Midlands:

- Dr. Halima Sacranie joined as our Director of Housing Research, bringing 17 years of experience from her research and teaching at the University of Birmingham and Aston University.
- We successfully completed our first substantive and large-scale research project, the West Midlands Social Housing Quality Fund Evaluation, for the West Midlands Combined Authority, strengthening our role as a trusted partner for impactful policy research.
- We welcomed a talented team of Research Associates, ready to tackle the region's pressing challenges and shape the future of the Midlands. These researchers draw on diverse skill sets and backgrounds in social policy, planning, architecture, urban design, place-making, community engagement, participatory research, human geography, construction and engineering.

In 2025, we are poised to build on our strong foundation by launching a **new research programme** around our 4 thematic workstreams that address the Midlands' most pressing issues.
